The first class is Monday, August 21st, 2006.

For the first day of class, please read the U.S. Constitution (pp. liii-lxxvii), in Rotunda, MODERN CONSTITUTIONAL LAW (Thompson West, 7 ed. 2003). Then, we will read the rest of Chapter 1, and Chapters 2. Then we will read the pages in the Supplement that refer to §5-1 and the Detainee cases. After that, we will read Chapters 3 & 4 and related pages in the 2006 SUPPLEMENT. Then, we will read Chapter 6, §§ 6-1 & 6-2. Finally, we will return to Chapter 5 and decide what parts of that chapter we will read next. For each class, please read about **30 pages** beyond where we finished in the previous class. If you do that, you will often be ahead of the class but never behind. Please note that, if there is an essay portion, you will have the option of composing your essay on a computer.

I expect regular class attendance, and reserve the right to take class attendance and class participation into account in setting your final grade.
