CHECKING ON THE STATUS OF APPLICATIONS

Applicants are responsible for monitoring the submission and completion of all application requirements. Requests for status checks on submitted applications should be made in writing, preferably by email, to the Admissions Office.

To protect the confidentiality of applications, we do not release any information on an application to anyone other than the applicant.

Admission of Visiting Students

Students attending other law schools may apply to George Mason School of Law for visiting status. George Mason Law accepts a number of visiting students each semester and for the summer term. Visiting students may not transfer to degree status.

Eligibility

A student in good standing at an ABA-accredited law school is eligible to apply to George Mason Law for admission as a visiting student. The student must obtain permission from his or her home law school to attend George Mason Law as a visiting student and confirmation that the credits earned will be accepted as transfer credits at the home law school.

For the fall and spring semesters, visiting students must carry a full course load of 8-11 credits (for part-time study) or 12-15 credits (full-time study).

Permission to be a visiting student is granted only on a semester basis. A student who visits during a fall or spring semester, or during a summer term, may submit a written request to renew his or her visiting status for an additional semester or for a summer term (subject, of course, to permission from the visitor's home law school). A student seeking to continue visiting status need not repeat the entire application process.

Final Semester Visitors

Students who visit at George Mason Law during their final semester are cautioned that George Mason Law cannot provide notification of grades or an official transcript to your home law school any earlier than we provide this information to our own law students. It is incumbent upon the visitor to check with his or her home law school to ensure that this will not create a graduation problem. Transcript Released to Home Law School

The Records Office of George Mason University School of Law will send automatically an official transcript of work undertaken at the law school to your home law school as soon as all grades have been recorded.

How to Apply

Applicants seeking visiting student admission must provide the following:

1. The visiting student application form and \$35 fee made payable to George Mason University.
2. Resume is optional.
3. A current, official transcript from the applicant's home law school in a sealed envelope bearing the registrar's signature across the sealed envelope flap.
4. A letter from the dean (or the dean's designate) of the home law school certifying good academic standing and authorizing the applicant to visit at George Mason Law. The letter should be in

a sealed envelope bearing the dean's signature across the sealed envelope flap.

5. A 300-word statement indicating your reasons for applying as a visiting student.
6. A complete, unofficial copy of the LSAC Law School Report (including writing sample and transcripts), which the applicant can obtain from the registrar's office at the home law school. **Please note that we will not request an applicant's LSDAS Report from LSAC unless specifically directed by the applicant to do so in lieu of receiving an unofficial copy.**
7. A signed Honor Code Certification. Copies of the George Mason University School of Law Honor Code and Certification are available on the "Applications" page of our website at: www.law.gmu.edu/admission/onlineapp.html.
8. Application for Virginia In-State Tuition Rates, if eligible.

You may request that certifications and transcripts be sent directly to George Mason Law, or they may be sent to you with the sender's signature across the sealed envelope flap. You may then send the unopened materials to us.
