Note 1 - Patent Law I & II: Patent Law I & II will not be offered during the day in 2018-2019. A four-credit Patent Law course will instead be offered during the day in Spring 2019 (covering Patent Law I & II). Students pursuing the Communications, Intellectual Property, or Technology Law concentrations may take either Patent Law I & II in the evening in Fall 2018 and Spring 2019, respectively, or Patent Law as a four-credit course during the day in Spring 2019.
