Third Year Day, Third Year Evening & Fourth Year Evening:

To graduate, you must complete all required courses, including:
(1) Professional Responsibility; (2) the upper-level writing requirement (one 400- or 600-level seminar and one "writing" course, or two 400- or 600-level seminars); and if you started your studies in or after fall 2016, (3) the experiential requirement (at least two credits of "experiential" coursework.)

The following are additional considerations when planning your schedule but is not a full list of all graduation requirements. Please consult the academic regulations for additional information and contact an academic advisor with any questions.

Full-time students entering their second year ranked in the bottom quartile of their class must complete a minimum of two core courses from the list below during their second year.

Part-time students entering their second year ranked in the bottom quartile of their class must complete a minimum of two core courses from the list below by the conclusion of their third year.

Full or part-time students entering their final year ranked in the bottom quartile of their class must:

- complete a minimum of two courses from the list of core courses below prior to graduation; and
- take and pass Legal Fundamentals (Law 178) prior to graduation. Any student who has been readmitted after matriculation was cancelled for failure to maintain minimum academic performance will be required to pass the Legal Fundamentals course as a condition of graduation.

Core Courses: Business Associations, Commercial Paper, Conflict of Laws, Constitutional Law II, Criminal Procedure I: Investigation, Evidence, Family Law, Income Tax, Remedies, Sales, Secured Finance, Trusts & Estates, Virginia Local Government Law, Virginia Practice, and Virginia Remedies.

NOTES:

(n.1) **Professional Responsibility:** Professional Responsibility must be completed sometime before graduation.

(n.2) **Litigation & Dispute Resolution Theory:** Litigation & Dispute Resolution is usually offered in the fall, but was not offered in fall 2019. Students pursuing the Litigation Track may take this course in spring 2020.

(n.3) **Patent Law:** Patent Law I & II are not being offered during the day in Academic Year 2019-2020. A four credit Patent Law course is instead being offered during the day in spring 2020 (covering Patent Law I & II in one course). Students pursuing the Patent Track may take either Patent Law I & II in the evening in fall 2019 and spring 2020, respectively, or Patent Law as a 4 credit course during the day in spring 2020.

(n.4) **Legal Practicum - Global Antitrust Regulatory Comments:** The Global Antitrust Regulatory Comments Legal Practicum (Law 304) has been approved by the faculty as an alternative course to Legal Practicum – Regulatory Comments (Law 300). Law 304 will count to meet the Regulatory Track requirement if taken in lieu of Law 300.
