### **Learning Outcomes:**

- 1. Students will understand and be able to communicate, both orally and in writing, basic principles of U.S. Family Law
- 2. Students will be able to examine factual scenarios implicating one or more Family Law questions, to determine the precise legal questions raised, the possible legal outcomes, and the benefits and costs of each of these outcomes.
- 3. Students will understand the separation and interaction of governmental powers affecting the family, at both the federal and state levels, and how to read and understand Family Law statutes, cases and regulations.
