COURSE DESCRIPTION

Trusts and Estates is one of the areas of law you will almost be guaranteed to encounter on your bar exam. It is also, in the field, one of the more interesting practices of law as it intersects with so many other practice areas. This course is designed to provide a practical approach to the field of trusts and estates. We will be using Wills, Trust and Estates in Focus for this semester. Although rooted in caselaw and statute, our approach will be conversation-based to work outside the frame of the coursebook.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

By the end of the semester, students should have acquired a working knowledge of trusts and estates, be conversant in this practice area and identify Virginia-specific nuances, as well as be able to identify other areas of law that may overlap in the day to day practice of trusts and estates.
