These are essential for everybody: BloombergLaw – includes a wealth of current awareness materials for lawyers. Is there a Practice Center on your topic? HeinOnline – Full text law reviews since inception. Field search—Boolean connectors <u>must</u> be in all capital letters. PLI Discover Plus: search for Practising Law Institute treatises and handbooks; download PDF versions of chapters. Covers many legal topics, very in-depth, CLE materials, too.

Use Legislative Insight if you are looking for a Compiled Legislative History. Use Regulatory Insight to find all agency rule-making documents related to a federal law or executive order since 1936 ("regulatory history").
