- Use subject terms to expand the search.
- The catalog can search more than just our catalog; for example, it searches articles and news, and nearby academic Libraries' holdings, too.
- Use [WorldCat](#) to search for books in any Library around the world.
- HathiTrust, Routledge, Oxford Scholarship Online, & JSTOR for e-books

We provide a list of all of our legal databases in alphabetical order. The librarian can suggest the databases that might be useful to you. These are essential for everybody:

- BloombergLaw – includes a wealth of current awareness materials for lawyers. Is there a Practice Center on your topic?
- HeinOnline – Full text law reviews since inception. Field search—Boolean connectors must be in all capital letters.
- PLI Discover Plus: search for Practising Law Institute treatises and handbooks; download PDF versions of chapters. Covers many legal topics, very in-depth, CLE materials, too.

[Here](#), you can search for non-law articles in interdisciplinary databases. The databases are arranged by subject, alphabetically, or can be searched by name. The most popular are:

- Business Source Complete (business, marketing, economics)
- Academic Search Complete (covers a variety of subjects)
- JSTOR (various social sciences, including law)
- EconLit (economics literature—very technical)

<input type="checkbox"/>	ProQuest Congressional, Legislative Insight, and ProQuest Regulatory Insight
--------------------------	---

- Use **Congressional** if your topic requires you to find a single legislative document such as a hearing, committee report, Congressional Record entry, or CRS report, or to find congressional documents when there is no Compiled Legislative History.
- Use **Legislative Insight** if you are looking for a Compiled Legislative History.
- Use **Regulatory Insight** to find all agency rule-making documents related to a federal law or executive order since 1936 (“regulatory history”).
