



LOG IN TO ZOOM APP

- You can download the Zoom app for your desktop at <https://zoom.us/download>. The Zoom app can also be downloaded for iOS or Android from the app store on your phone.
 - The below screenshots show the login process for the desktop app, but the steps are the same for the mobile app.
- Open the app and click “Sign In.”
 - If you are signed into your personal Zoom account, make sure to sign out before trying to log in to your GMU account.
- Select the “Sign in with SSO” option.
